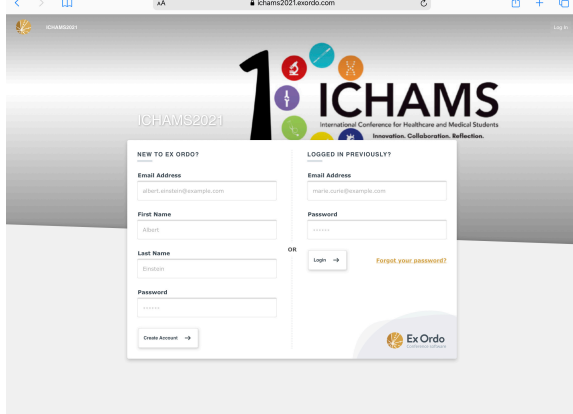
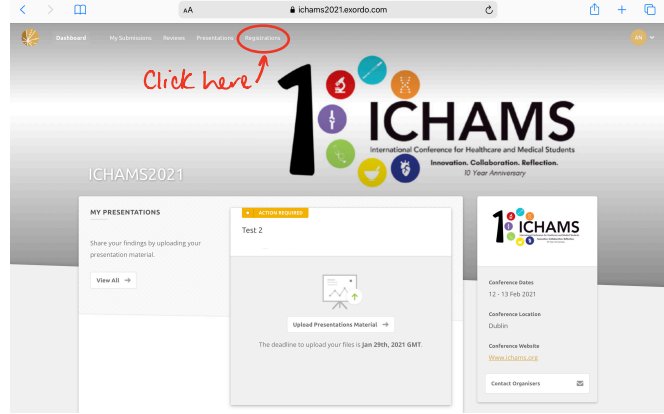


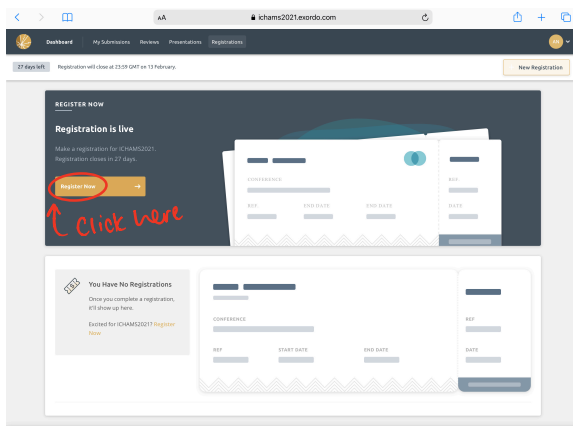
Step 1: Log into ExOrdo using your login details.



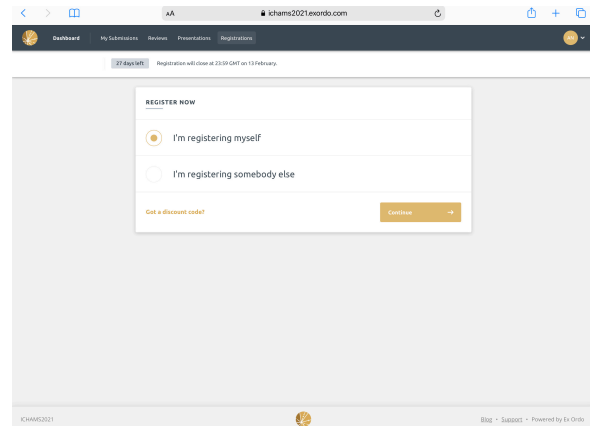
Step 2: Click on the Registrations tab on the top left



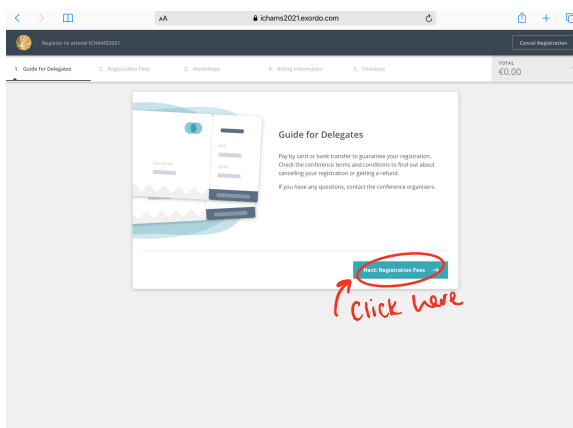
Step 3: If you are registering for the first time, click Register now. (If you have already registered and paid your registration fees, skip to step 6)



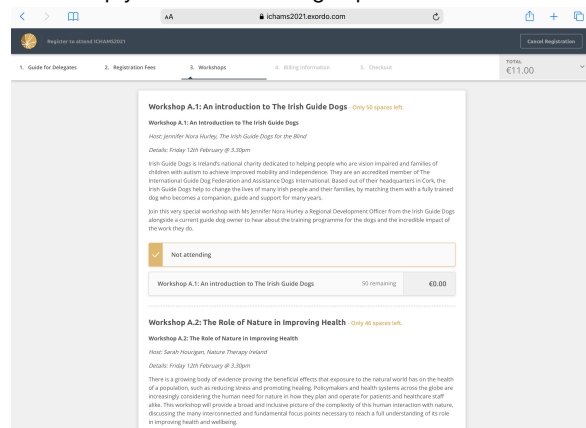
Step 4: Click on the registration option which applies to you
